Modern Slavery & Human Trafficking Statement

Financial Year Ending 31 March 2026

This statement is made pursuant to Section 54(1) of the **Modern Slavery Act 2015** and sets out the steps **Outsourced Events Limited** has taken and continues to take to prevent modern slavery and human trafficking in our business and supply chains.

1. Our business structure and supply chains

Outsourced Events Limited is a specialist event management agency delivering tailored event logistics, operations, and project support across the commercial and public sectors. We provide full-service event management, including inventory handling, shipping, and operational support for events, as well as roundtable and experiential event solutions.

Our supply chain includes UK-based and international providers of:

- Event technology and logistics
- Print and promotional merchandise
- Courier and freight services
- Venues and hospitality
- Freelance and agency labour

We primarily engage suppliers through direct procurement or established framework agreements.

2. Our policies and commitments

Outsourced Events is committed to the highest standards of ethical conduct and integrity. We have a **zero-tolerance policy** toward modern slavery, human trafficking, servitude, and forced labour. This commitment is supported by the following internal policies:

- Code of Conduct
- Anti-Slavery & Human Trafficking Policy
- Recruitment & Right-to-Work Compliance
- Diversity, Equity & Inclusion Policy
- Supplier Code of Conduct

All staff have access to these policies via our internal systems, and they are reviewed annually.

3. Due diligence in our operations and supply chain

To assess and mitigate modern slavery risk, we:

- Conduct due diligence on new suppliers, including reviewing their Modern Slavery Statements (where required)
- Include anti-slavery clauses in contracts and framework agreements



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- Assess the risk level of suppliers based on geography, sector, and employment practices
- Require confirmation of right-to-work documentation for all employees and contractors
- Use ethical sourcing criteria when selecting vendors and partners

4. Risk assessment and management

We assess our modern slavery risks annually across operations, sectors, and supplier relationships. Our current risk profile is considered **low**, based on the nature of our services and the maturity of our supply chain partners.

We are actively monitoring areas of potential elevated risk such as:

- International freight and logistics providers
- Labour agencies in high-volume event staffing
- Merchandise supply originating from outside the UK/EU

5. Training and awareness

We provide annual training for:

- Procurement, HR, and operational staff on identifying and managing modern slavery risks
- All new employees during onboarding, with refreshers incorporated into mandatory compliance training

6. Effectiveness and KPIs

To measure the effectiveness of our efforts, we:

- Track completion rates of staff training
- Monitor supplier compliance through contract reviews
- Investigate and log any concerns raised by our team
- · Conduct internal audits of our due diligence processes annually

7. Future commitments

In the year ahead, we will:

- Continue to strengthen due diligence procedures for higher-risk suppliers
- Expand ethical sourcing criteria to cover environmental and social impacts
- Collaborate with peers and clients to raise awareness across the event supply chain
